Essential Job Functions:

- Caring for the medical needs of campers and staff at Camp
- Oversee the health and wellness of approximately 35 campers and 15 staff
- Conduct initial health screening of all campers and staff

• Provide medical attention to campers and staff with general health concerns and document in Health Log

• Distribute and record camper medications

- Maintain Health Center record and medical forms
- Supervises health and sanitation at children's camp
- Maintains camper's confidential medical history

• Oversees initial health screening of campers and daily health surveillance of camp occupants

• Handles health emergencies and injuries, including emergency preparedness and provisions for professional health care

- Maintains camp's daily medical log
- Reports required incidents to local health department within 24 hours

Qualifications

- RN degree (licensed in the State of New York) or New York State EMT Certification
- Flexible able to adapt to different environments and schedules
- Confidence in nursing skills
- Responsible, hard-working
- Good bedside manner, friendly and personable
- Strong assessment abilities
- Prior experience with children (does not have to be in a medical capacity)
- Desire and ability to be a team player
- Enjoy an active lifestyle
- Must submit health history record and examination form prior to first day of work
- Have a genuine interest in working with and concern for children with special needs
- Ability to interact with boys and girls ages 5-18 with varying ability levels

Physical Aspects of the Position:

• Physical ability to live and work in a rustic camp setting and to address emergencies (weather, etc.) as they might arise

• Ability to verbally communicate and work with youth with varying social skills and academic difficulties (all age and skill levels) and provide necessary instruction to campers and staff about health issues

• Ability to visually and auditorily observe camper behavior, assess its appropriateness, enforce relevant safety regulations and emergency procedures, and apply appropriate behavior management techniques

• Ability to visually and auditorily observe staff behavior, assess its appropriateness, enforce appropriate safety regulations and emergency procedures, and apply appropriate management techniques

• Visual and auditory ability to identify and respond to environmental and other hazards related to an activity

• Physical ability to respond appropriately to situations requiring First Aid. Must be able to assist campers in an emergency (fire, evacuation, illness, or injury) and possess strength and endurance required to maintain constant supervision of campers

• Endurance including prolonged standing, some bending, stooping, walking long distances, hiking, climbing, and stretching; requires eye-hand coordination and manual dexterity to manipulate outdoor equipment and camp activities; requires normal range of hearing and eyesight to record, prepare, and communicate appropriate camper activities/programs and the ability to lift up-to 50 pounds

• Willingness to live in a camp setting and work irregular hours with limited or simple equipment and facilities; and with daily exposure to the sun, heat, and animals such as bugs, snakes, bats, etc.
